Modern Foreign Languages (Mandarin) overview



Year 3 Introduction to Mandarin

Listening:

Understand a range of familiar spoken phrases and begin to understand conversations – e.g.

- expressions of greetings and phrases; -e.g. hello, how are you, goodbye, thank you, what's your name, sorry etc.
- numbers
- understand conversations about time, date, family, etc.
- teacher's instructions and school
- Pick up a few words in a song

Speaking:

Say and/or repeat a few words and short simple phrases - e.g.

- expressions of greetings
- self-introduction, include name,
- numbers (1-100)
- parts of the body e.g. head, arms, legs
- days and months of the year
- family: mum, dad, brother, sister, grandma, grandad, aunt, uncle
- Verbs (see, know)

Begin to understand the different meanings that different tones represent Begin to know the difference of the 4 tones.

Reading:

Recognises and reads out a few familiar words or phrases in pinyin and beginning to recognise some characters – e.g.

- pictographic characters such as 山、水、月、木
- Hello, goodbye
- Numbers 1-100
- Family
- the date

Use visual clues to help with reading

Writing:

Follow teacher to write or copy simple words- e.g.

- hello
- pictographic characters

- personal information such as age
- numbers 1-10

Intercultural Understanding:

Understand how symbols, objects and pictures can represent China.

Identify similarities and differences in my culture to that of another.

Talk about festivals in Chinese cultures

Year 4 Listening:

Understand a range of familiar spoken phrases – e.g.

- basic phrases concerning myself, my family and school
- understand conversations about family
- begin to know hobbies

Respond to a clear model of language.

Speaking:

Answer simple questions and give basic information- e.g.

- what the weather is like
- time and date
- description of appearance, size, location, action, emotion
- Hobbies I like

Understand the different meanings that different tones represent

Be able to ask simple/answer questions

Reading:

Understands about 40 or more mandarin words and some simple phrases and sentences; Understands some familiar written phrases – e.g.

- how are you
- what's your name?
- date
- who is in my family
- simple weather phrases
- basic descriptions of objects such as colour and size

Writing:

Follow teacher to write or copy simple words- e.g.

- pictographic characters
- personal information such as age
- numbers 1-10

Select appropriate words to complete short phrases or sentences.

Intercultural Understanding:

Identify similarities and differences in my culture to that of another.

Talk about festivals in Chinese cultures

Year 5 Listening:

Understand a range of words, familiar spoken phrases and sentences – e.g.

personal information

(name, age, nationality, occupation, hobby, family members etc.)

understand some key words from a short-spoken passage

Speaking:

Ask and answer simple questions- e.g.

- quantity
- ask question about time and date
- ask questions with "ma"
- description of appearance, size, location, action, emotion
- naming classroom objects
- different places e.g. hospital, shop, restaurant

Know more about tones, intonation and stress

Reading:

Understands about 60 or more mandarin words and some simple phrases and sentences

Understands the most of the main point(s) from a short-written text – e.g. simple messages on a postcard/in an email

Writing:

Write some single-component characters e.g.

- Numbers (11-100)
- 上、下、大、小 etc.

Begin to know the basic strokes and stroke order of Chinese characters;

Begin to know some Chinese radicals e.g. 1、口、女、; etc.

Intercultural Understanding:

Respect and understand cultural diversity.

Know more about ancient and modern China and Chinese culture through some videos.

Year 6 Listening:

Understand a range of words, familiar spoken phrases and sentences;

Understand most of the main points and some of the detail from a short-spoken passage – e.g.

- where, when, who what, why
- an announcement

Speaking:

Take part in a simple conversation

- quantity
- time and date
- begin to ask simple who, what, where, when, why- questions
- description of appearance, size, location, action, emotion

Use some common mandarin sentence pattern to ask questions and express opinion e.g.

- the "shi" sentence (is)
- the "you" sentence (have)
- the "zai" sentence (where)

Pronunciation is becoming more accurate and intonation is being developed.

Reading:

Understands about 80-150 mandarin words and some simple phrases and sentences

Understand the most of the main points and some of the detail from a short-written text, like simple stories written in Chinese.

Writing:

Write more single-component characters;

Understand the structure of Chinese characters;

Understand how Chinese characters were created;

Know more Chinese radicals;

Begin to write a few sentences with words provided

Intercultural Understanding:

Discuss and present information about China's culture.
