<p>Speaking, Listening & Writing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research and write a non-chronological report about the changes of medicine in history and the impact of key discoveries on our lives today. • Heart surgeons Find out about some famous heart surgeons. What do you need to study to become a heart surgeon? How long would it take if you started right now? What skills and personality would make you successful in this role? • Collect evidence for a persuasive piece of writing about Blood Donation. Gather as much evidence to support your argument for your writing in class? 	<p>Problems, Science & Maths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Here are some links from Oak Academy, to practise Fractions. <p>Unit - Oak National Academy (thenational.academy)</p> <p>Unit - Oak National Academy (thenational.academy)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Keep learning your timetables too. 	<p>Wider Curriculum</p> <p>Different animals' hearts Find out about the size and structure of a human heart and compare it to the size, structure and number of hearts in other animals – worms have five!</p> <p>Pulse and exercise Find out about the different pulse points on the human body, including the side of the neck (carotid), wrist (radial), top of the thigh (femoral) and elbow crease (brachial). Test the different pulse points – which one has the strongest pulse? Measure your family's resting heart rates before putting them through their paces. Ask them to hop, skip, jump and run, measuring their heart rates after each activity. Fill in a table with everyone's results before looking for patterns in the data. Who has the slowest heart rate? Which exercise caused the biggest increase in heart rate?</p>
