



A Celebration of Mrs Jackson!!

As a school we are so incredibly proud of our very own Mrs Jackson! Not only a superb teacher but founder and leader of our Mandarin language lessons here at Sacred Heart. Recently Mrs Jacksons had the amazing opportunity to represent Sacred Heart on a world stage when she was invited to China to present on the collaborative work with the USTB Confucius Institute at De Monfort University.

A massive **THANK YOU** to Mrs Jackson from all of us here at Sacred Heart for all your hard work and dedication to the development of Mandarin in our beautiful school.

On the second weekend during November Beijing hosted the 2025 annual Chinese World Communication and Language Conference. Our colleagues from the USTB Confucius Institute at De Monfort University; Director Yi along with Justine Jackson the Chief Practitioner of the Mandarin Teaching Hub and teacher at Sacred Heart Catholic Voluntary Academy in Leicester were lucky attendees of the event.

Justine Jackson, the Hub's Chief Practitioner was one of the few non-native Chinese speakers invited to give a talk on the progression of Mandarin teaching in diverse schools within Leicester through digital empowerment. During the talk she elaborated on the demographics of Leicester, particularly her school, Sacred Heart CV Academy. How she had developed their Mandarin curriculum into a standardized curriculum with high outcomes especially for EAL and SEND learners. Justine also talked about the development of the Mandarin Hub to both support schools already teaching Mandarin and to encourage more schools across Leicester to take up this language. Director Yi and her team at USTB CI at DMU along with Justine Jackson Chief Practitioner, worked especially hard at creating a digital platform for the Hub that can be accessed by all teachers. The focus of the conference, being on digital technology in the educational environment, showcased the Leicester Mandarin Teaching Hub's excellent work in digitizing its work in order to cut teacher workload while increasing student engagement. During her talk Justine showed examples of this highlighting the pilot work done at Sacred Heart Academy where the students who were the first in Leicester city to take part in the YCT exam in 2024 scored an above 89% pass rate and how lessons have progressed to using digital technology including introducing VR experiences such as "Ne Zha 2" allowing children an immersive first person view of Chinese animations and culture.

The work carried out through the USTB Confucius Institute at DMU and the Mandarin Teaching Hub along with **Justine Jackson** Chief Practitioner prove that Mandarin teaching excellence is achievable in diverse settings. The model being created by the Leicester Mandarin Teaching Hub has the ability to enhance and embed learning and proves its sustainability and scalability. Their belief that Primary Schools are fundamental in inspiring children on their educational journey has ensured that all school children part taking in Mandarin lessons through DMU Confucius Institute and the Leicester Mandarin Hub are prepared not just with language skills, but with the crosscultural competence and digital fluency they need to thrive as future global citizens.

The work of these dedicated educational practitioners has been commended on the world stage, and we look forward to seeing how they evolve the Mandarin Teaching Hub further.

Press Release for the sister school collaboration between USTB Primary and Sacred Heart Catholic Voluntary Academy.

On Monday 17th November the Head Teacher from USTB along with her senior staff met with Director Yi from the Confucius Institute based at DMU and Justine Jackson the Chief Practitioner of the Leicester Mandarin Teaching Hub and teacher at Sacred Heart Catholic Voluntary Academy in Leicester. Their meeting was to formally announce the working partnership between the two schools. This partnership is to provide the children from both schools with cross cultural links. While the children at Sacred Heart CV Academy in Leicester are learning Mandarin the children at USTB Primary are learning English which means that the children will be able to form lasting bonds through collaborative work. Staff shared a little about their schools, their background, working practice and demographics of the areas. They spoke of what they would like to do as their partnership moves forward and are planning some online collaboration where children can share celebrations from their own cultures and perhaps take part in joint online classes. Each school then shared gifts as a token of friendship before taking a tour of USTB Primary. Congratulations to all involved and we look forward to hearing more about the schools collaboration in the future.

Children will no longer be able to chat to adult strangers on Roblox - one of the world's most popular gaming platforms - as part of an expansion of its safety measures. Mandatory age checks will be introduced for accounts using chat features, starting in December for Australia, New Zealand and the Netherlands, then the rest of the globe from January.

ROBLOX

Roblox is one of the most popular video games among children. In 2020, the game's developers claimed that more than half of the USA's children had played it. As a 'sandbox' title, the game lets players create their own gaming experiences with Roblox Studio to build custom levels, which can then be shared online.

ONLINE PLAY RISKS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Because Roblox connects random players across the world, it can put younger players into an environment with anonymous users who could use the platform for nefarious reasons. For example, some role-play games are used for online dates and mature role play, which could expose youngsters to inappropriate messages in the public chat box.

MATURE CONTENT

Content is difficult to moderate throughout Roblox, due to the number of games available. This is particularly notable on smaller games and experiences, but in summary, some of the games and experiences offered on the platform contain age-inappropriate content that could easily be seen by young players.

IN-GAME SPENDING

The majority of games within Roblox have extensive monetisation options, usually through season passes or microtransactions. Purchases can range in value from a few pennies up to much larger sums of money. While some games offer a lot of content via purchases, others can offer very little for real world money, causing younger players to end up out of pocket.

ANONYMOUS PLAYERS

The anonymity of users can leave players vulnerable to bullying, harassment, and predatory behaviour. Without the right parental controls or monitoring, users can connect with each other via personal messages or friend requests, and it is very difficult to know who's helpind a usergame in this vast online world

RISK OF ADDICTION

Roblox games can feature rewarding or satisfying mechanics that keep players coming back – or persuade them to stay logged-in for much longer. Like most games, they focus on interactivity, with constant rewards via in-game unlocks and currencies, which can sometimes lead to an addictive need to remain suite for long register of times.

SCAMS

Many of the games on Roblox feature collectible items, pets, or characters. These objects, while digital, are worth a lot of real money on certain online markets. Scammers will attempt to trade with younger users in the hopes of getting rare items that can be sold for real money, manipulating the child into handing them over, usually via misleading information.

Advice for Parents & Educators

MONITOR THE CONTENT

While Roblox does implement plenty of moderation tools and parental controls, it's up to parents and guardians to monitor the types of games a child or impressionable player is experiencing. If a youngster wants to play Roblox, be sure to check out which specific games they want to play within it, and get a good idea of their content.

TAKE ADVANTAGE OF TOOLS

Use the parental controls within the game itself and teach youngsters how to report and block other players. Knowing the powers within their reach will make Roblox a safer, happier experience. You can set age ranges for who's allowed to contact you, close public chat boxes, block spending, and even make your Roblox profile completely private. All these options are helpful in cutting off bad actors from engaging with children.

PLAY TOGETHER

Consider playing Roblox with the children in your care. There are few more effective ways to see how monetisation works, gauge whether the game could lead to addictive behaviours, or even witness how interaction between players works, than sitting down and trying the game for yourself. This should help you figure out whether it's suitable for particular children.


TEACH ONLINE BEHAVIOURS

Have an open conversation about the risks of online play and how to spend money wisely. By being honest and giving tips on how a younger user can protect themselves, you can empower them to not only take care of themselves, but others too. Any user can be reported to Robiox moderators by other players for behaving inappropriately. With this knowledge, younger players can be aware of what to look for and help prevent it.

The Food Store

Emergency Provision & Affordable Shopping. Our Food Store exists to help those with restricted or no financial means to access food on receipt of a referral.

What do we offer?

Our food bank is set up like a small shop. With the guidance of our volunteers, those referred are equipped to make choices for themselves regarding the food that they receive.

The Open Hands Food Store offers essential goods such as UHT milk, tea, cereal, pasta, soup, baked beans, tinned vegetables, tinned fruit, and other cupboard items. Each week the store has a variety of different extras such as flour, coffee, oil, bakery, refrigerated and frozen goods. These vary depending on the donations that Open Hands receives.

We aim to take our clients on a journey towards independence, whereby people learn to reserve money for food as part of their budget.

To support this goal, we offer **emergency crisis support (no cost)** and **affordable shopping (half retail prices)** services:

Emergency Food Provision - Crisis Support (no cost)

Our Emergency Food Store is for individuals who have no financial means to pay for food. Households can be referred for a maximum of 6 consecutive weekly visits (1 per week, each visit provides access to one week's worth of food for the household at no cost). This gives people the time to process a benefits application where eligible, and/or seek additional help with money, budget management or other professional support.

After this 6-week period clients will be given the opportunity to transfer to our affordable shopping service (outlined above).

Please note that referred individuals living in fully catered accommodation (e.g. hotels and hostels) are not eligible for this service.
