

OUR OFSTED REPORT



Why are schools inspected?

Ofsted checks how well schools are doing. To ensure children are safe, taught well and supported to do their best. Ofsted visits schools around every four years and we had our visit on the 6th and 7th of January 2026. Inspectors check eight separate areas of our school as well as reporting what it is like to attend our school. We have summarised the findings below.

SAFEGUARDING

Safeguarding is effective. Systems are in place to keep children safe, staff are trained, and concerns are acted on quickly.

INCLUSION

Inclusion is a strength of the school. Staff know pupils well and work hard to remove barriers so all children can take part and succeed, including pupils with SEND and those needing extra support.

PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT AND WELLBEING

Pupils are supported well with their personal development. The school helps pupils build confidence, character and wider life skills, with strong pastoral support. Pupils are given opportunities to take on responsibility, learn about the world around them, and develop respect for others.

ACHIEVEMENT

Children are learning well and making progress from where they started. This includes children who need extra help. The school is working hard to keep improving results.

ATTENDANCE AND BEHAVIOUR

Behaviour is positive and expectations are clear. Attendance has been a key focus and is improving, with leaders and staff taking action to support families.

CURRICULUM AND TEACHING

The curriculum is ambitious and planned carefully from early years onwards. There is a strong focus on language, reading and vocabulary to help pupils access learning.

EARLY YEARS

Children in early years get a positive start. Staff place strong emphasis on early language, phonics and communication, and children are prepared for next steps.

LEADERSHIP AND GOVERNANCE

Leaders, governors and Trust leaders understand the school's needs and have clear plans for continued improvement. They work together to support staff and pupils well.

WHAT IS IT LIKE TO BE A PUPIL HERE?

Pupils are cared for and known well by staff. They feel safe in school and know there are trusted adults they can talk to if they are worried. Classrooms are calm, expectations are clear, and pupils are encouraged to try their best. The school helps pupils with both learning and wellbeing, so children can grow in confidence and enjoy school.
